



Courses Offered


1. **Trailblazers** (1 hour session, 9am & 11am)


Older Scout Adventures

*** 2 adult leaders attend free with a minimum of 5 scouts attending. Gold Status troops (bringing more than 80% of registered scouts) get another leader at no charge.



Important Deadlines/Reminders

- Troop youth rosters are due by **March 15.**
 - Unit registration numbers will be used to assess eligibility to “hold” a site (minimum of 10 Scouts)
- Early Bird Registration: **4/15/2026**
- Registration fees are due no later than **4 weeks prior to the start of your camp week**

- **Camp Check-In Process**
 - Arrival begins at 1:00pm, with Orientation starting at 2:00pm
 - Provisional Scouts should check in at the Alderman Center at 2:00pm
 - An adult leader must check each unit in at the Alderman Center. All adults staying longer than the drop-off period must also sign in.
 - Any adults arriving throughout the week must also sign in immediately upon arrival
